



Selection Policy for Singapore University Archery Team ASEAN University Games 2026 Bangi, Malaysia

1. Summary of Important Information

2. General Information

- 2.1. The ASEAN University Games 2026 (AUG 2026) will be held in Malaysia from 10 to 19 December 2026.
- 2.2. The Singapore University Sports Council (SUSC) is planning to send an Archery Team to compete in AUG 2026, subject to athletes' qualification.
- 2.3. The travelling dates for the Archery Team will tentatively be from 12 to 19 Dec 2026 (competition dates are 14 - 18 Dec 2026).
- 2.4. On behalf of SUSC, the Nanyang Technological University (NTU) will manage the team's coordination, athlete communication, and Games preparation.

- 2.5. Athletes who are interested in standing for selection must inform Chiang Chai Liang or Neo Wanxian via chiangcl@ntu.edu.sg or wanxian.neo@ntu.edu.sg through their institution staff advisor latest by 10 August 2026, 12pm. (Remark: Current university archers have informed by 24 March 2026 while pending finalised policy to be released.)
- 2.6. In-coming year 1 student (AY26/27) must be archer competing actively in the open categories prior to the start of AY26/27. Any result/s achieved between 01 Dec 2025 to 06 Sept 2026 substantiated via IANSEO system could be used for qualification purpose.

3. Eligibility

- 3.1. Only the following may participate as athletes in AUG 2026:

- 3.1.1. Students who are currently officially registered as proceeding towards a degree or diploma at the university or similar institute, the status of which is recognised by the appropriate national/regional academic authority of their country/region;
- 3.1.2. Former students of the institutions mentioned in 3.1.1 who obtained their academic degree or diploma in the calendar year preceding the event.

- 3.2. All athletes must satisfy the following conditions:

- 3.2.1. Be a Singapore Citizen of the country/region they represent.
- 3.2.2. Be at least 18 and no older than 27 years of age on the 31 December of the year of the event (i.e., born between 1 Jan 1999 to 31 Dec 2008).

- 3.3. All eligible athletes must agree to bear the full cost of preparation and participation. Any subsidy and funding will be between the athlete and his/her respective institutions.

4. Events

- 4.1 The following archery events will be held at AUG2026 (*do note that there will be a limited number of entries that each participating country can send per event*):

5. Selection of Athletes

5.1. Selection and participation are open only to current and incoming students of SUSC member universities – NTU, NUS, SIM, SIT, SMU, SUSS, SUTD, in compliance with the eligibility criteria outlined in Clause 3. All interested students are required to approach their respective institutions and submit the registration form for the selection trials through their institutions by the stipulated deadline.

5.2. The criteria for athletes who wish to register interest and participate in the selection trials of the AUG Archery Team are as follows:

5.2.1. Not undergoing any disciplinary proceedings or serving any suspension by Archery Association of Singapore (AAS).

5.3. Selection details

5.3.1. Qualifying Marks & Provisional Qualification Marks

5.3.1.1. Set at Aug2024 5th Placing And 8th Placing Marks Respectively

5.3.2. All archers who hit QM in any trial session and IAC between 01 Dec 2025 to 06 Sept 2026 (SAO26) will be invited to the squad.

5.3.3. Archers in NATT or NYATT 2026 will be invited to the squad (AY26 intake eligible too).

5.3.4. After considering 5.3.2 and 5.3.3, should there be less than 4 archers who have hit QM in any category, archers who hit PQM would be considered. Number of archer/s who met PQM invited to the squad would depend on the category – all categories to only have a maximum of 4 archers in the squad.

5.3.5. After considering 5.3.2 to 5.3.3, should there be more than 4 archers eligible to be invited to the squad, archers who hit QM will have priority over archers who only hit PQM.

5.3.6. PQM ranking:

5.3.6.1. Number of times PQM is met – the higher number will be ranked top.

5.3.6.2. To break tie on above (5.3.6.1), the highest PQM scored will be ranked top.

5.4. For event category with no one meeting the QM/PQM, SUSC may consider the athlete with the highest/closest mark based on the Singapore Archery Open (Sept 2026) results.

5.5. Individual University reserves the rights not to endorse or to offer reduced/no funding support to archers who only hit PQM or are recommended under clause 5.4.

5.6. SUSC will have the final decision.

6. Athletes' Obligations

6.1. Selected athletes must fully comply with SUSC and NSA (if applicable) rules, regulations and policies.

6.2. Selected athletes must fully comply with all anti-doping regulations. Athletes who require Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE) have the duty to obtain one at least three months before the commencement of competition. Conduct themselves professionally as representatives of Singapore University Sports.

6.3. Selected athletes must maintain a level of fitness and performance consistent with the requirements of being a national representative.

6.4. Upon qualification, athletes must continue to show commitment towards preparing for AUG 2026, including all organised training sessions (including their training plan and progress report). Failure to do so may result in being dropped from the team.

7. Cost and Funding

7.1. The participation cost per athlete is estimated to be between \$2,000 and \$2,500 and will be subjected to changes. The cost includes accreditation fee, participation fee, travel expenses, insurance, attire, coaching, and others.

7.2. Selected athletes and/or the athletes' institution shall bear full cost of participating in AUG 2026, as well as the preparations leading up to it.

7.3. Athletes should check with their respective institutions with regards to subsidies, without which, the selected athlete is required to bear the full cost.

7.4. Selection does not constitute funding approval. Funding support varies across universities, and selected athletes should check directly with their respective university on available subsidies or support.
